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THE TOWN OF ALFORD'S COMMUNITY CHOICE POWER SUPPLY PROGRAM



You may be paying too much for your electricity! In April 2025, the Town of Alford launched its Community Choice Power Supply Program. This Program is a municipal aggregation which enables local government to combine the purchasing power of its residents and businesses to provide them with an alternative electricity supply option (M.G.L. c. 164, § 134). The Town's current supplier is **First Point Power**.

National Grid has identified your account as either: (1) receiving electricity from a third-party supplier or (2) enrolled in their GreenUp program. The Town suggests checking your National Grid electric bill to determine your current supplier and rate (per kWh) as the Town's Program may be able to help provide some relief.

The Town's aggregation rate is in effect **for all rate classes for 32 months** as follows:

Term	Rate (Supply Only)	Renewable Energy Content
March 2026 to November 2028	\$0.15000 per kWh	Meets MA renewable energy requirements
<i>[Rate applies to service beginning and ending on the days of the month that your meter is read in your service area. This date varies by account.]</i>		

Everyone in Town is eligible to join this Program and may OPT-IN at any time. Some suppliers have a termination fee for leaving their contract early. **Please check with your current supplier and confirm that you will not incur an exit fee before enrolling in the Town's Program.**
