WARWICK ENERGY PROGRAM ANNOUNCES NEW RATES AND SUPPLIER

WARWICK, MA – The Town of Warwick has signed a thirty-four month contract with a new supplier, First point Power. The Warwick Community Choice Power Supply Community Choice Power Supply Program, tailored to meet the specific needs of the Town’s electricity ratepayers, will continue to offer three options, however two of the products have changed:

For Warwick residents and businesses who are enrolled in the Town’s standard product, the current rate of \$0.15136 per kWh will expire and the new rate of \$0.13045 per kWh will take effect with the January 2026 meter reads. This represents a decrease of \$13 per month on the supply side of the bill given average usage of 600 kWh. In addition, this new rate is 16 percent lower than National Grid’s Residential Basic Service rate of \$0.15484 per kWh. Residents can expect to see an average savings of \$15 per month for the month of January 2026. National Grid’s Basic Service rates will change on February 1, 2026 and should be known in late December.

Warwick launched its electricity program in August 2020 in an effort to develop an energy program that would be stable, affordable and incorporate renewable energy. From inception through June 2025, the Program has saved residents and small businesses over \$421,000 in electricity costs as compared to National Grid Basic Service.

It is important to note that no action will be required by individual consumers. This change will be seen on the February 2026 bills. All accounts currently enrolled in the Program will remain with their current product offering (consistent with the chart above, renewable energy content may have changed) and see the new rate and First Point Power printed under the “Supply Services” section of their monthly bill.

The Warwick Community Choice Power Supply Program has no fees or charges. However, anyone switching from a contract with a third-party supplier may be subject to penalties or early termination fees charged by that supplier. Ratepayers should verify terms before switching.

Basic Service rates change twice a year or more, depending on rate class. As a result, the aggregation rate may not always be lower than the Basic Service rate. The goal of the aggregation is to deliver savings over the life of the program against National Grid Basic Service. However, future savings cannot be guaranteed.
